The blower will shut off. Press the farthermost button on the left (the Ramp button) and the left-arrow button right beside it, simultaneously, and hold them both down (around 5 seconds) until P-1 shows up on the display. This will indicate you are in the Setup Mode. At this point, you will be allowed to cycle through the setup menu. As you depress either the left or right arrow key, you will land on several icons on the display that indicate which setting you can adjust. You want to get to the cm H2O icon. Depress either left or right buttons to change your pressure setting. When you are done, simply press Ramp and the left-arrow button simultaneously, and hold until P-0 flashes briefly. You are then back in the standard operating mode. Please note that the left-arrow key independently. I found this was easiest to achieve by using my index finger to depress the Ramp button, and my pointer finger to depress the leftmost edge of the left-arrow button. I hope this helps others. So I was a bit scared to change the settings once I knew how. I was told I would have to call the sleep MD office, get an appointment, convince them why I need to have the cm raised, and then wait for him to contact the company who provided it. And has "all control" over it, I quess. I was able to raise my pressure a little without having to go through all that time-wasting (and govt money wasting) ridiculousness. I have asthma, and if it kicks in a little while I'm sleeping, maybe due to the humidifier going on and off, I need to breathe in more sharply and the air needs to move faster. So far, I've been sleeping 12 hours at a time and waking up super groggy. I am so glad to be able to make this change immediately and not wait a week while I lie down with a suffocating sensation.
